JOB DESCRIPTION: RADIO OPERATOR

PURPOSE

To describe examples of essential duties and responsibilities, other duties and responsibilities, qualification requirements and demands of the individual performing the task of Radio Operator.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Listed below are representative descriptions of the kinds of essential duties and responsibilities that this position includes

- Radio Operator is responsible for the operation of the station base radio.
- He/she shall deploy certain "10" codes as deemed pertinent by the Chief. If situation warrants "10" codes may be eliminated.
- At any mutual aid fire calls, "10" codes will be eliminated. Plain talk will be used.
- Basic CB talk, slang, will not be used.
- He/she will help to instruct probationary firefighters on the use of all the radio equipment.
- He/she will fill out all forms consisting of times, personnel on call, etc. This information will be printed in a legible handwriting in ink with the understanding that these records may end up in a court of law.
- He/she will not leave the radio unattended for any reason.
- He/she will be responsible for making all phone calls necessary for proper notifications during a fire or other emergency response.
- He/she shall turn over to the Fire Chief all records pertaining to Northern Piatt radio dispatch. All records will be as accurate as possible.
- He/she will make himself/herself aware of what vehicles have left the station and with how many personnel.
